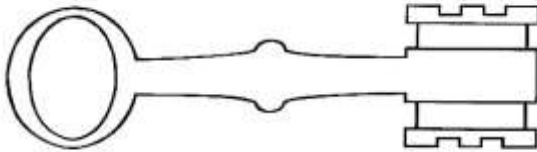

Debbie Kennett is an internationally recognised speaker on DNA and surnames. She regularly gives talks throughout the UK and Ireland and has spoken at international conferences in Canada, the US and Portugal. She is an Honorary Research Associate in the Department of Genetics, Evolution and Environment at University College London.

Autosomal DNA demystified

Millions of people have now had their DNA tested and DNA testing is becoming an increasingly useful tool as an aid to family history research. It can be used not just to verify the paper trail but can also help to break down brick walls and solve long-standing family history mysteries. An autosomal DNA test gives you matches with genetic cousins on all your family lines. In this talk we will look at some practical examples showing how the tests work and learn about some of the fascinating cases that have been solved through DNA detective work.

Y-DNA and mtDNA demystified

Y-chromosome DNA (Y-DNA) is passed on from father to son and therefore usually corresponds with the inheritance of surnames. This makes it an important tool for surname research. Mitochondrial DNA (mtDNA) is passed on through the all-female line. Men inherit mtDNA from their mothers but can't pass it on. In this session we will explore how to get the best out of Y-DNA and mtDNA testing and how to use these tests in your genealogy research.

George Redmonds is a historian specialising in names, studies & local history he has lectured widely in Europe, North America, Australia & New Zealand. His most recent publication is a Dictionary of Yorkshire surnames.

Regional Surnames: In this talk George who has had a lifetime researching Yorkshire surnames & trying to put right all the things that are misconceptions or origins & meanings.

Peter Higginbotham has written many books & articles as well as contributing to Radio TV Programms such as "Who Do You Think You Are" & Heir Hunters.

Childrens Homes Peter will talk on the Institutions that became home for Britains Children & Young People.
